Dry nose & pads



Hyperkeratosis in dogs is a skin disease which consists of an excessive production of keratin (a protein present in skin, hair and claws), especially on nose and/or on footpads.

It leads to skin thickening and hardening. Affected areas may crack and become sometimes infected.



HOW TO TREAT HYPERKERATOSIS?



Manage the underlying cause and the potential infection with proper treatments (ex. antibiotics)

HOW TO SPOT THEM?

A callus is the normal response to repeated pressure on hard surfaces. Large dog breeds are often affected, especially on the elbows (pressure point calluses), because of their greater weight.

Over time, a round unsightly wound appears where the skin has been in contact with the floor or ground. Hair loss occurs, the skin thickens, becomes blue-grey with crusts & even cracks. Secondary infection should be suspected.



WHAT IS THE SOLUTION?

Pressure point calluses grow in size very quickly and local treatment is recommended in order to prevent them from developing or to reduce their size whilst preventing infections. Dry skin should be softened using skin cares with excellent moisturizing properties.

Pad protection

Your pets' paw pads are naturally resilient. However, they can be subjected to considerable trauma in certain situations.

- 1. Intense or prolonged physical activities: long walks, canicross/agility, hunting, dog sled races...can cause foot pads to overheat leading to possible small cuts or abrasions.
