The **ONE PUFF**TM is a controlled system that performs a specific function, depending on the mask used for the specific newborn small animal. The Aspiration Mask "A" is designed to administer a safe vacuum suction to remove mucus blocking the animal's airway. Respiration Mask "B" is designed to provide a small release of air to stimulate respiratory response. **ONE PUFF**TM has been tested to consistently deliver 5 to 10 ml of air pressure, a level which has been proven safe for newborn small animals.

How to use the One Puff[™] Aspirator / Resuscitator Kit:

Prior to first use of the ONE PUFF[™], clean in 1:20 bleach / water solution and dry thoroughly.

ASPIRATING



- To test the Aspiration Mask, use the end of the unit labeled "**A**". If the aspiration unit is functioning properly, there should be a slight vacuum sensation when holding the pre-assembled unit against user's arm while pumping the instrument.
- If the animal is not breathing after delivery or C-section, pick the animal up gently with head facing downward at a 45° to 90° angle from the horizon.
- Place mask labeled "**A**" securely over muzzle of animal, ensuring the muzzle is clearly in position to receive the air movement.
- Compress instrument trigger once to aspirate the animal, then remove mask.
- Gently massage the thoracic area, behind the front legs and in front of the stomach. Check for breathing reflex. If no breathing occurs, proceed to resuscitation.

RESUSCITATING



- To test the Resuscitation Mask, use the end of the unit labeled "**B**". If the resuscitation unit is functioning properly, there should be a slight release of air when holding the pre-assembled unit against user's arm while pumping the instrument.
- Place mask labeled "**B**" securely over muzzle of animal, ensuring the muzzle is clearly in position to receive the air movement.
- Compress instrument trigger once, then remove mask.
- Gently massage the thoracic area, behind the front legs and in front of the stomach. Allow a few moments for the animal to establish breathing reflex.
- If no breathing reflex is observed, repeat resuscitation process until successful breathing is achieved.

DO NOT pump the **ONE PUFF**^T instrument continuously while aspirating or resuscitating as this could have a detrimental effect on the newborn small animal. Only one or two puffs are necessary for stimulation of the animal's natural respiratory response.
