## **Important Safety Information**

- · Warning: May be habit-forming
- · Caution is required in pets with impaired kidney or liver function, hypervolemia, anemia, and cardiac or respiratory impairment. Monitoring may be required for prolonged therapy.
- · Adverse events are rare and typically resolve upon the withdrawal of therapy. Ataxia and sedation are commonly noticed at the beginning of therapy but are typically transitory and disappear in most animals.
- · NOBATOL tablets are flavored. To avoid accidental ingestion, store tablets in original container and out of reach of children and animals. Accidental ingestion can be fatal, especially to children.
- · Use caution when administering this product to animals. It is recommended that you wear disposable gloves when administering the medication to minimize contact with the skin. Wash hands thoroughly after administration.
- · NOBATOL tablets have a range of known interactions with other drugs. Phenobarbital is a well-known inducer of hepatic microsomal P-450 enzymes, as well as plasma proteins involved in binding drugs. Special attention should be paid to the pharmacokinetics and doses of drugs concurrently administered.
- · Do not confuse phenobarbital with pentobarbital.
