**HISTORY:** Patient exhibited chronic dermatitis since about 6-12 months of age, due to allergies with recurring secondary bacterial infections. Previous skin scraping was negative; previous ACTT Immunotherapy testing showed allergic responses to trees, grasses, molds, chicken, turkey and soy.

Treatments during her first 7 years of age included immunotherapy, triamcinolone, antihistamines (hydroxyzine and chlorpheniramine), antimicrobials (cephalexin, ketoconazole and cyclosporin), trimeprazine with prednisolone, omega-3 supplementation, medicated baths and multiple diet changes.

Diets previously fed included lams<sup>™</sup> Veterinary Formula<sup>™</sup> Skin & Coat Plus Response<sup>™</sup> FP, Royal Canin Veterinary Diet<sup>®</sup> Canine Selected Protein Adult<sup>™</sup> PV, prescribed homemade diet of tuna, brown rice, broccoli and kale, and Royal Canin Veterinary Diet<sup>®</sup> Canine Anallergenic (later name changed to Royal Canin Veterinary Diet<sup>®</sup> Canine Ultamino<sup>®</sup>).

Skin condition only improved when fed the homemade diet, but Baby Ray lost significant weight while on that food.

### **INITIAL FINDINGS**

- Chronic dermatitis
- Red, inflamed pustules on abdomen, axillae and inguinal areas
- Interdigital spaces, chin and throat area red and inflamed
- Excessive pruritus
- 6-7 out of 10 on itch scale

#### DIAGNOSIS

• Chronic allergic dermatitis

#### MANAGEMENT

- Immediate switch to Blue Buffalo Natural Veterinary Diet<sup>®</sup> HF Hydrolyzed for Food Intolerance (no slow transition)
- Cephalexin as needed
- Omega fatty acid supplements
- Weekly medicated baths

- Skin inflammation visibly improved

- 2-3 out of 10 on itch scale
