Your Pet's Blood Pressure

Just as you have your blood pressure checked every time you visit the doctor, your veterinarian should be checking your pet's blood pressure. As in humans, abnormally high or low blood pressure can indicate further health problems. Regular screening is an essential part of comprehensive, preventative animal health care.

Blood pressure is even more important in older cats and dogs. As pets age, they are more at risk for high blood pressure and other related complications. Even at a young age, starting blood pressure measurements gives your veterinarian a baseline to compare to if your pet's health condition changes later in life.

Ask your veterinarian to check your pet's blood pressure. There are many ways to help your pet's blood pressure stay within the healthy range:

- · Regular exercise
- · Healthy diet
- · Reduce stress

Blood Pressure Measurement Can Save You Money

The longer high blood pressure is left untreated in a cat or dog, the more likely the chances of developing symptoms that can adversely affect your pet's quality of life. Neglecting to treat high blood pressure can lead to blindness, kidney failure, or even congestive heart failure. Catching high blood pressure early and treating it immediately through diet, exercise, or drugs, may save you thousands in medical bills by avoiding expensive medical conditions.

Why Your Pet's Blood Pressure Matters

Regularly monitoring your pet's blood pressure (BP) can:

- · Lead to the earlier diagnosis of diseases
- Avoid other diseases linked to sustained low or high BP
- Help evaluate the effectiveness of ongoing treatments

Outcomes of Sustained High BP

Brain: hemorrhage, seizures, dementia, neurological deficit

Heart: left ventricular hypertrophy, alterations in arteries and arterioles

Eye: blindness, glaucoma, hemorrhage, retinal detachment

Kidney: glomerulosclerosis, glomerular atrophy, tubular degeneration, interstitial fibrosis

Symptoms of LOW BP

· Low urine output

Fainting

Symptoms of HIGH BP

- Seizures
- Disorientation
- Weakness
- Blindness
- Dilated pupils
- · Blood in urine

III	160-179	100-119	Moderate
IV	≥180	≥120	Severe
